


The members of AAUW-Illinois & IWPA invite you meet

Sarah Watt's terrifically life-affirming new film, shown here last October as part of the 41st annual Chicago International Film Festival, will open in Los Angeles & New York in April, however we invite YOU to a special Chicago theatrical premiere on Saturday, March 18th at the Landmark Century Centre Cinema.

Although this is Ms. Watt's first feature film, she is an award-winning animator, & we will be showing samples of her earlier work in addition to screening *LOOK BOTH WAYS*.

Since its release, *LOOK BOTH WAYS* has racked up an impressive list of accolades including Best Film, Best Direction, Best Original Screenplay, & Best Supporting Actor awards from the Australian Film Institute, as well as the Discovery Award from the Toronto International Film Festival jury. It was also named the 2005 "Film of the Year" by the Australian Catholic Film Office. "It is certainly a meditation on how we should love our neighbours as we love ourselves", said Father Richard Leonard SJ in his review.
